



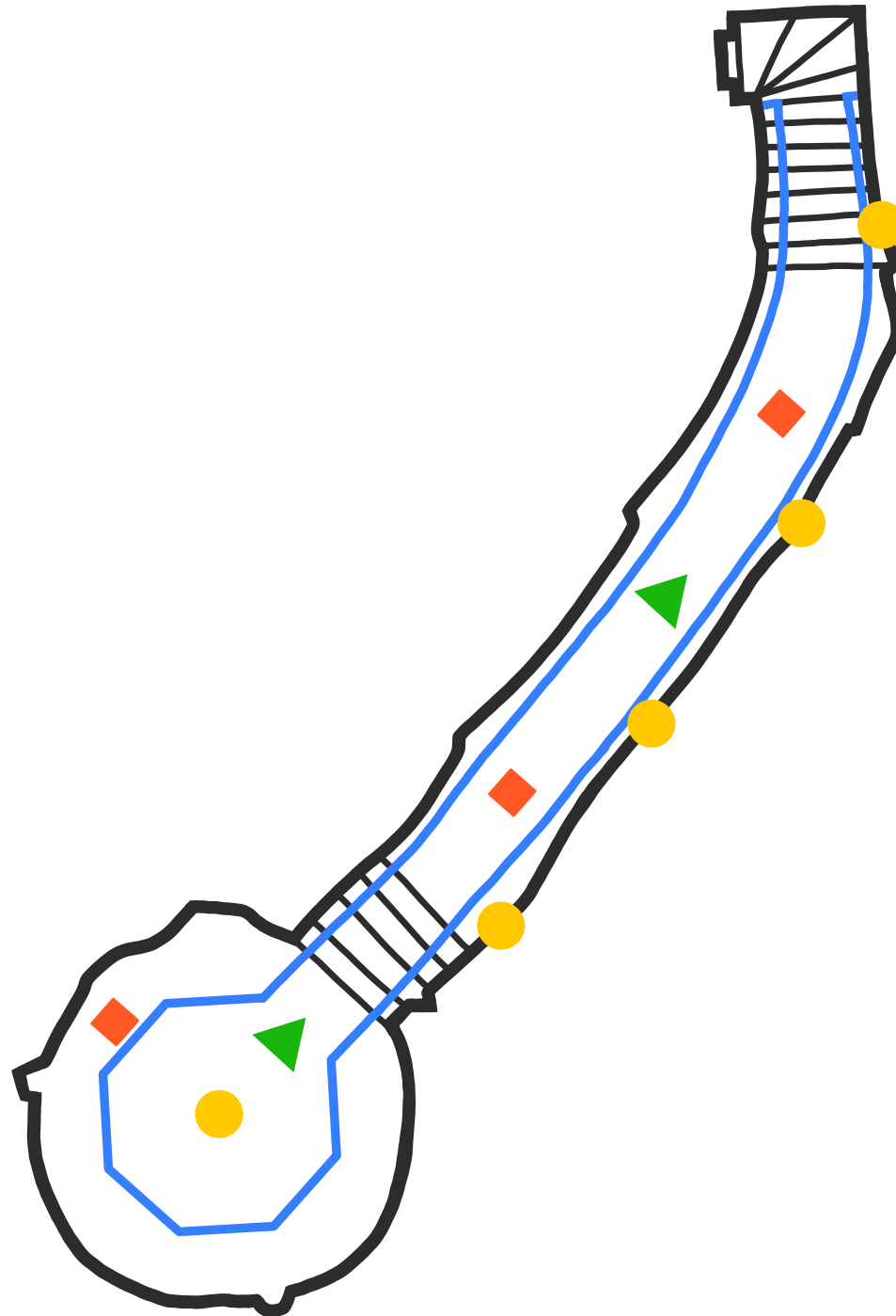
## Sensory Map

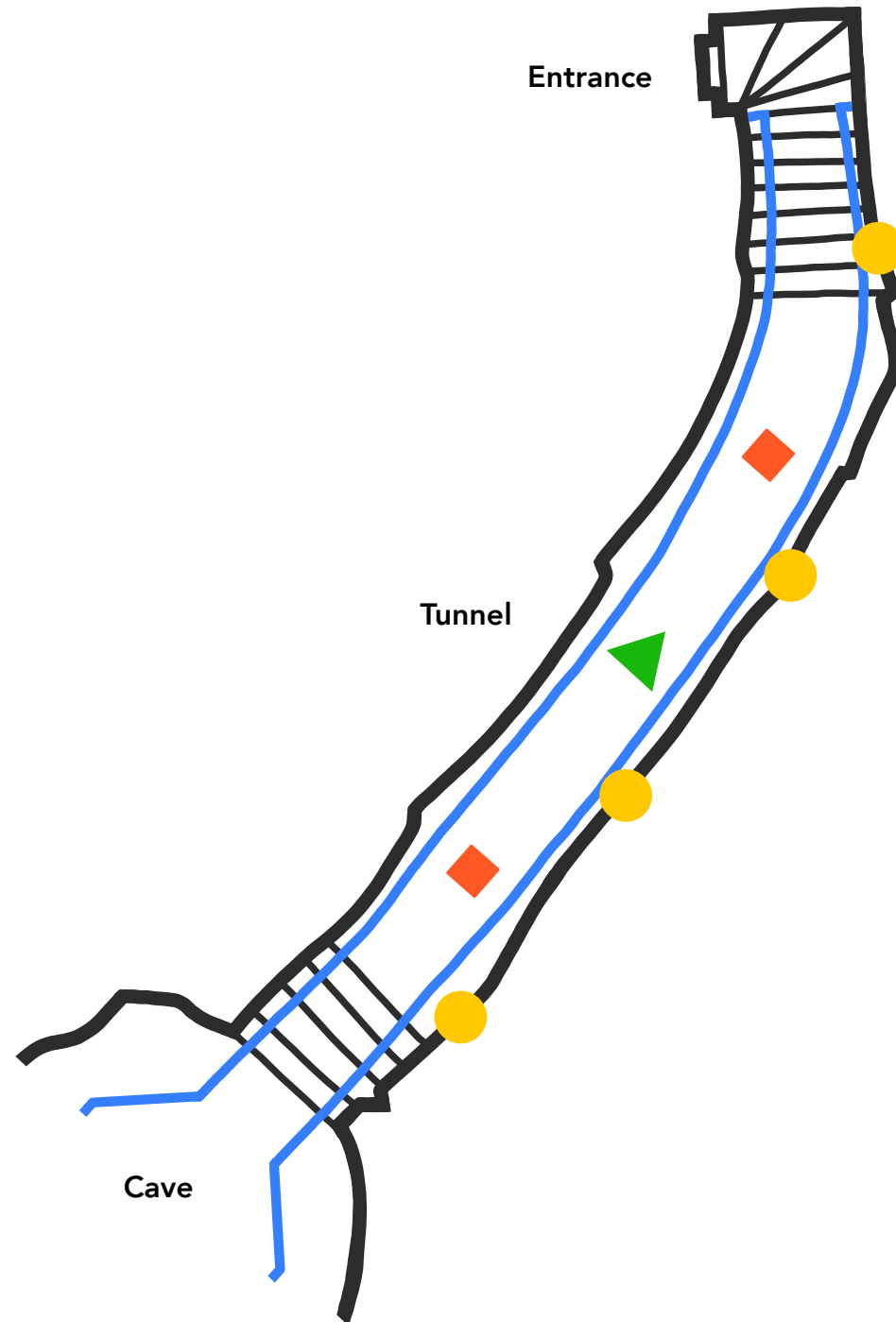
## The Tunnel

The access tunnel to Royston Cave might be damp and smell like wet earth. The handrails on either side might also be wet to touch.

The tunnel is small and can feel quite cramped. The floor is steep and uneven.

Voices echo in the tunnel. It is well lit and lights appear bright.

-  **Sight** - Bright lights
-  **Smell** - Wet, earthy smells
-  **Sound** - Echoey voices
-  **Touch** - Wet handrails









## The Cave

Royston Cave is damp and might smell like wet earth. The railings might also be wet to touch.

The cave is small and can feel quite cramped. It is dimly lit and dark in contrast to the tunnel.

Voices echo in the cave. You can hear cars above. An audio tape is played which is loud and echoey.

-  **Sight** - Dimly lit
-  **Smell** - Wet, earthy smells
-  **Sound** - Loud audio tape  
- Car noises above  
- Echoey voices
-  **Touch** - Wet handrails
